- A Master of Science in Nursing degree from an accredited college or university with a minimum of 3.0 GPA in graduate studies.
- A current unencumbered license to practice nursing in the State of Texas or one of the compact states recognized by the State of Texas.
- Documentation of supervised clinical practicum hours in a MSN program.
- Three professional or academic references.
- An in-person interview with UIW graduate faculty will be arranged for qualified individuals.

Application cycle begins every May for Spring semester start date.
