Program Overview

The Nursing program prepares a graduate who is a beginning generalist in the practice of professional nursing. The UIW graduate is qualified to take a national exam to be licensed as a Registered Nurse (RN). Graduates are also prepared to pursue advanced education in specialized nursing fields. For nearly a century, UIW's nursing program has been a regional leader for nursing excellence and education.

Professional School Opportunities

Graduate options include Doctor of Nursing Practice, Adult Clinical Nurse Specialist, and Clinical Nurse Leader.

Career Opportunities

Choosing a career in nursing is an economic decision in more ways than one. The supply of nurses today cannot meet the demand. Because of this, nursing graduates can expect to work immediately in a professional practice setting, often with greater benefits and salaries than ever before. Settings for practice continue to expand beyond the familiar ones of clinics, hospitals and schools.

Special Programs: Direct Admission to Nursing

The direct admission option is available to qualified first time freshman applicants with outstanding high school academic records. Students accepted for direct admission begin taking nursing courses along with prerequisite courses during the freshman year at UIW. Entry to the nursing major is guaranteed for a direct admit student who completes all nursing requirements and prerequisite courses with a 3.0 GPA or higher.
